AREAS OF FOCUS

BULLYING | 2.14.18

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS & SCHOOL SAFETY | 10.11.2017

Emergency preparedness and school safety are ongoing focuses for the E2 Committee.

Marin Emergency Radio Authority (MERA Radio System) – In collaboration with key staff at all participating school districts have been trained and monthly tests are conducted, alternating between all schools and local talk groups including north, south, west, and central school district sites.

School/Law Enforcement Partnership (SLEP) – In collaboration with schools, law enforcement and community agencies, SLEP supports countywide efforts to keep Marin schools and communities safe and healthy environments for all students and families.

IMMIGRATION | 11.8.2017

San Rafael City Schools (SRCS) shared the development of protocols related to Immigration & Customs Enforcement (ICE) activity in an effort to provide guidance to school leaders and to create equity from one school site to another.

HOUSING

Affordable housing is at the forefront of current topics and the E2 Collaborative continues to learn of resources to identify opportunities for collaboration with local agencies for initiatives that benefit Marin county school districts.

Marin Housing Crisis Action Group | 10.11.2017

Mission is to create, build, and preserve much-needed housing in Marin by bringing together diverse organizations and individuals who care deeply about their communities. The Committee receives updates on local housing advocacy efforts in Marin.

Groups

Association of California School Administrators (ACSA) and Marin County School Administrators Association (MCSAA)

ACSA is the statewide administrators' association which focuses on legislation, advocacy, and professional development opportunities for its members. Regional Council leaders are appointed by ACSA.

The MCSAA is the local version of ACSA where county school administrators meet and discuss pertinent legislation, participate in professional development activities, and have an opportunity to network among colleagues.

Efficiency and Effectiveness Team (E2)

Shared Services means that school districts collaborate with one another and with other entities to efficiently and effectively maintain or enhance their educational offerings, administrative operations, and other school activities. By sharing services, school districts can leverage collective strengths, focus on economies of scale and reduce redundant efforts. The group meets at MCOE several times per year.

Housing Task Force

Task Force to focus on housing needs for school employees.

Golden Bell

The Golden Bell committee plans the annual Golden Bell awards ceremony which honors teachers, administrators, educators, employees, trustees, and student programs countywide. The Committee meets monthly at MCOE leading up to the awards ceremony which is scheduled in May at Dominican University.

Innovative Leadership Team of Marin

(formerly Countywide Learning Collaborative)

The ILTM's goal is to transform instructional practices that lead to improved student achievement. The ILTM meets monthly at MCOE.

Joint Legislative Advisory Committee (JLAC)

JLAC is composed of trustees and superintendents throughout the county with the purpose of working with a Sacramento-based legislative advocate to track on key legislation that impacts schools. While JLAC does not typically act on legislation as a whole, committee members may take information back to their districts to seek action. JLAC meets monthly at MCOE and takes an annual advocacy trip to Sacramento in January.

Marin Association of Superintendents (MAS)

The MAS is the professional network of superintendents within the county. Monthly meetings are held to address issues in education throughout the county and to focus on professional development.

Marin Schools Insurance Authority (MSIA)

The MSIA is a Joint Powers Authority established in 1985 to self-insure in the areas of workers' compensation, property, liability, dental, and vision. Members may partake in one or more of the sponsored programs. MSIA is comprised of the Marin County Office of Education, 18 school districts, and one Transportation District. The MSIA Board meets about 4 times per year at MCOE.

Operational Steering Committee (OSC)

The OSC oversees the policy and direction of the Marin County Special Education Local Plan Area (SELPA), evaluates the SELPA Director, oversees the financial operations, and the operations manuals and protocols for the SELPA. Representatives are assigned to represent their specific geographical area within the county.

The OSC meets on the first Wednesday of the month at the MCOE at 7:30 a.m.

School Law Enforcement Partnership (SLEP)

The goal of the Marin County School/Law Enforcement Partnership, a collaboration of schools, law enforcement, and community agencies, is to encourage and support a countywide effort to keep Marin schools and communities as safe and healthy environments for all students and families. Meetings include training/information sessions (i.e., suicide prevention, sex trafficking, school safety, trauma informed systems) and updates from local law enforcement and schools. SLEP meets about 5 times per year at MCOE.
